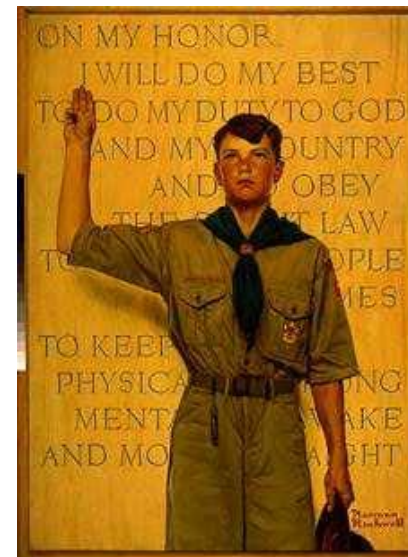

OUR PHILOSOPHY

ACTIVITIES

SERVICE

The troop also does service regularly including maintaining a section of the Bonneville Shoreline Trail near Bridal Veil Falls, sponsoring the flag

day ceremony for the Provo Freedom Festival, sponsoring a sub for Santa family and doing various service projects for individuals, schools and the community.

TRADITIONAL VALUES

We are a very traditional scouting group.

We expect boys to wear the scout uniform and to uphold the scouting principles de-

tailed in the Scout Oath and Law. We expect our boys to behave like scouts at all times, whether they are at a scout meeting, at school or at home.



PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Parents are an important part of our troop. We strongly encourage parental involvement in our troop and parents are always



welcome at any troop activity. All parents are automatically members of the troop committee and we hold a monthly parents meeting to discuss what the troop is doing and to determine what we as adults can do to support the boys.

ADULT LEADERS

Our adult leaders have decades of leadership experience, not just a few weeks on the job. Our scoutmaster has over 25 years of experience as a scoutmaster and a degree in child psychology. Our assistant scoutmasters typically have five to 10 years of adult scouting experience each.
